
WANTED ALIVE!



SHACKLEFORD APPLE

Sighted at Montezuma County Fair, Cortez, CO in the years of 1903, 1905, 1906, & 1909; winner of top premiums. Grown by W. I. Myler, W. H. Blake, W. R. Honaker, Galloway Bros., Ben Porter, & C. T. Leavell. Sighted at the Colorado State Fair, 1910. Last seen in Fremont County, CO circa 1920 w/ 77 trees left standing in Lincoln Park and 15 trees in East Canon.

Described as a Ben Davis type apple.
Originated in Clark County Missouri, near
Athens. Tree prolific, hardy, & healthy & said to
flourish in poor land. Fruit medium to large,
roundish to roundish oblong; dots
inconspicuous, small, numerous, sometimes
russeted or submerged; stem long and
slender in a slightly russeted cavity; calyx
closed; basin medium to large, rather wide,
abrupt, wrinkled; skin thick, waxy, smooth, pale
greenish yellow washed with red & mottled &
striped with carmine. Flesh tinged yellow, firm,
moderately course, crisp, juicy, mild subacid.
Ripens late season.
